The review zeroed in on open-plan workplaces in nine customary structures, while the subsequent review enveloped both open-plan and confidential workplaces in 24 structures, including 12 green and 12 regular structures. The analysis revealed a number of significant findings regarding the factors that influence workplace environmental and job satisfaction. These discoveries have suggestions for work environment plan and the executives works on, highlighting the significance of making sound, agreeable, and ecologically feasible office conditions to advance representative fulfillment and efficiency.

4) Jeon and Choi, (2012), The connection' between' customer and Employee' contentment. Using dyadic data, the purpose' of this study was to investigate relationship between customer satisfaction' (CS) and Employee' satisfaction' (ES) in an educational service setting. Customer satisfaction' (CS) is positively correlated with Employee' satisfaction' (ES), indicating a unilateral relationship between the two variables. In the context of educational services, this study sheds light on the connection between customer satisfaction' and Employee' satisfaction'.

5) Khan (2020). The Relationship Between Leadership, Customer Satisfaction', Employee' Satisfaction', Customer Orientation, and Organizational Performance in the Textile Industry, was to determine whether leadership had a positive and significant moderating effect on all exogenous and endogenous variables in the textile industry, including customer intention, customer satisfaction', Employee' satisfaction', and organizational performance. This study's findings emphasize how leadership influences organizational performance in the textile industry.

The review uncovered a positive connection between representative fulfillment and hierarchical execution, with worker fulfillment distinguished as a forerunner to authoritative achievement.

The study, which was designed using a relational model, was conducted on 400 Employees who worked in 27 textile companies.
