

# Integrating Traditional Warli Art into Modern Bedroom Interiors

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**Abstract:** This study explores the integration of traditional Warli art in modern bedroom interiors, examining how cultural heritage can be harmoniously blended with contemporary design elements to create a balanced, aesthetic living space. As modern interior design increasingly leans toward minimalism and clean aesthetics, there is a growing gap between contemporary spaces and traditional Indian art forms. This research aims to merge cultural richness with functional, aesthetic minimalism. The objective of this research is to investigate how Warli art, with its geometric patterns and cultural significance, can be seamlessly incorporated into minimalist bedroom interiors, enhancing both the cultural and visual appeal of the space. The study uses a visual analysis of modern bedroom designs, surveys, and conceptual design experimentation to explore potential ways to integrate Warli art into modern bedroom interiors, particularly focusing on wall panels and furniture. The findings suggest that Warli art's simplicity and geometric nature make it a suitable candidate for modern, minimalist bedroom designs, particularly in wall treatments and furniture details. The integration of Warli art does not overwhelm the minimalist aesthetic but instead enriches it with cultural depth. This research highlights the potential of blending traditional Indian art forms, like Warli, with modern design principles, fostering an environment where cultural heritage is preserved while creating functional and visually pleasing interiors. The research evaluates possible applications of Warli motifs in spaces designed with neutral color palettes and modern materials. Particular attention is given to design details like carved wall panels, accent walls, and strip carvings between modern panels, using materials like wood and MDF. This research contributes to the ongoing dialogue between modern design practices and cultural preservation, offering design strategies that are both meaningful and aesthetically relevant.

## INTRODUCTION

Warli art, a tribal art form originating from the indigenous Warli community of Maharashtra, India.

This represents its symbolic and ethnic simplicity and strong cultural roots. Traditionally created using white pigment on mud walls, Warli compositions depict daily life, nature, and rituals through plain and stick figures, nature motifs, and geometric shapes such as circles, triangles, and lines. Despite being ancient, Warli art possesses a timeless visual language that resonates with the aesthetic principles of modern design—minimalism, repetition, and order. In contrast, modern interior design emphasizes functionality, clean lines, minimal textures, simple shapes, neutral tones, and uncluttered spaces that promotes a sense of calm. Within this design language, the bedroom has evolved into a space not only for rest but also for self-expression, calm, and cultural individuality. As homeowners and designers increasingly seek to blend personal identity with contemporary design, integrating traditional art forms like Warli presents a unique opportunity to enrich modern interiors with meaning and narrative. People now want to add elements from their culture or heritage into their modern homes, especially in ways that are subtle and stylish. This research paper looks at how Warli art can be effectively integrated into modern bedroom interiors without disrupting the minimalist aesthetic. The main goal is to identify design strategies that allow the coexistence of cultural art form and modern sensibilities through applications such as wall carvings, panels, and accent elements and furniture details. The motivation behind this research lies in the growing desire to preserve and adapt indigenous art forms in contemporary contexts. By examining the visual and conceptual compatibility between Warli art and modern interiors, this study highlights the potential for creating culturally enriched, visually balanced, and emotionally resonant bedroom spaces. And hopes to inspire designs that respect tradition while staying fresh and modern. Also

broaden the conversation on how tradition can find new relevance in today’s design environments.

### METHODOLOGY

The methodology adopted for this research includes three main components: visual analysis, a user-based survey, and design experimentation. Together, these approaches aim to explore, understand, and illustrate how Warli art can be thoughtfully integrated into modern bedroom interiors in a way that balances tradition with contemporary design.

a. **VISUAL ANALYSIS:** A visual analysis was conducted by preparing detailed interior elevation drawings for a bedroom, created to show how Warli art can be incorporated into a modern space through surfaces, furnishings, and lighting without disrupting the modern aesthetic of the room. The analysis focuses on four walls labelled AA’, BB’, CC’, and DD’:

- Elevation AA’ showcases the bedside wall, which is the central focal point of the room. This wall features a bed flanked by two side tables, with a full-width wall panelling backdrop. A carved Warli border has been incorporated at the ends and curved edges on both the panels to act as an artistic headboard accent, enhancing the wall with cultural depth while maintaining visual simplicity.
- Elevation BB’ represents the wardrobe wall, designed with a sliding wardrobe allocated separately for male and female users. To symbolically distinguish the two sides, Warli carvings specific to each gender’s space have been engraved onto their respective wardrobe panels. Additionally, the entry door on this wall features a minimal Warli border and motif, creating a cohesive and culturally rich look across the elevation.
- Elevation CC’ presents the dressing/washroom access wall. Here, the entry to the dresser is concealed, blending seamlessly into the panelling with subtle Warli carvings that beautify the surface without drawing excessive attention. A TV unit is placed adjacent to the hidden door, designed with vertical T-shaped strips on the wall panel. Between two wall panels on this elevation, a gap is left intentionally where


minimal Warli motifs and borders are carved onto the exposed wall surface. This section is highlighted using hidden strip lights or cove lighting, complemented by a pendant light placed in front of an armchair to create a soft, art-focused corner.

- Elevation DD’ features a large window that brings natural light into the bedroom framed by curtain panels. These curtain panels flanking the window are enhanced with carved Warli borders and minimal motifs, adding a traditional touch to an otherwise plain surface. These carvings follow a linear, vertical alignment that complements the modern look of the window treatment while adding a layer of artistic and cultural significance.


Beyond the architectural surfaces, the Warli theme is thoughtfully extended to the upholstery and furniture elements within the room. Items such as the armchair, curtains, and cushion fabrics feature embroidered or printed minimal Warli motifs, carefully placed to avoid visual clutter. Additionally, furniture pieces like the side tables, bed, and TV unit cabinet are detailed with subtle Warli-inspired patterns either through shallow carvings, laser etching. This consistent use of motif throughout different materials and surfaces ensures that Warli art is not just a decorative layer but a unifying design language across the entire bedroom. The result is a space that balances modern comfort with traditional identity.

b. **SURVEY:** A Google Form survey was conducted with 34 respondents to understand awareness, preferences, and acceptance of Warli art in modern bedroom interiors.


- **Age Group:** Most participants were aged 20–40, showing strong interest from a young, design-aware audience.




- Warli Art Awareness: 73.5% had heard of Warli art.




- Preferred Placement: Warli was most preferred on wall panels (52.9%), wardrobe doors (50%), and headboards.



- Common Applications Seen: Warli is often seen on clothing, wall décor, and home items.



- Color Choices: Popular color suggestions were beige, white, terracotta, and grey.



- Bedroom Preferences:
  1. 64.7% want traditional art in bedrooms.
  2. Most preferred carved Warli motifs over painted or printed.
  3. Minimal and subtle design was preferred by 58.8%.




FIG.1: Preferred Warli Application in Bedroom

- Wardrobe Panels with Separate Motifs: When asked about using individual Warli motifs on wardrobe panels to represent different users (e.g., male/female sides in a master bedroom), 35.3% responded positively, while 50% remained neutral. Only 14.7% disagreed with the idea.






FIG.2 User Preference for Warli Art Style in Bedroom


- Warli Carving on Furniture: When asked about Warli carvings on furniture like armchairs, side tables, or bed frames: 55.9% preferred it only on selected pieces, 32.4% said yes to the idea, 11.8% said no.




- Motivation: People would include Warli art to support Indian craft, show cultural connection, and add uniqueness.
- Cultural Value: Over 80% agreed that integrating Warli helps preserve heritage.

c. DESIGN EXPERIMENTATION: Based on findings from the visual analysis a complete design concept for a bedroom was developed using AutoCAD. The experimentation involved drafting:


- Four detailed wall elevations (AA', BB', CC', and DD') with furniture layout plan




ELEVATION AA'




ELEVATION BB'




ELEVATION CC'

## LITERATURE REVIEW

- **AKSHA BHAVE & APURVA THOSAR (2023)**  
The study explored how tribal art forms like Warli can enrich interior spaces by adding cultural identity and aesthetic appeal. The authors emphasized that incorporating such art promotes cultural appreciation. This supports the integration of Warli art not just as decoration but as a meaningful cultural element that gives depth and identity to modern bedroom interiors
- **S. JOSHITHA, A. YAKSHITHA & MARIYAM ADNAN (2023)**  
The study demonstrated how Warli motifs can be applied to garments to appeal to a younger audience. They conducted a survey that showed Warli art's positive reception in the fashion industry. Their approach to recontextualizing Warli for modern consumers inspires my research to thoughtfully adapt Warli motifs in bedroom interiors, making them relatable and widely accepted.
- **MEENU SRIVASTAVA (2019)**  
The study emphasized Warli art as a reflection of tribal lifestyle and underlined the importance of preserving it while adapting it to contemporary trends. Her insights support the integration of Warli art into modern bedroom design, as this not only enriches the aesthetic but also aids in preserving traditional cultural values.
- **BHAGATH MAYUR KUMAR PATEL & SRISHTI SRIVASTAVA (2020)**  
The study traced the origins and evolution of Warli art from the Warli tribe of Maharashtra and highlighted its transition from traditional wall paintings to elements of contemporary interior décor. It emphasized the adaptability and continued relevance of Warli art in modern design. This provides historical context and supports the integration of Warli art into modern bedroom interiors.
- **GRISHMA (2024)**  
The study evaluated government initiatives aimed at promoting Warli art as a brand and highlighted its growing presence in home décor and appeal in

modern interior settings. This underscores the increasing marketability of Warli art, suggesting that its incorporation into bedroom interiors aligns with current design trends and evolving consumer interests.

- **DR. HIRESH LUHAR & GRISHMA PATIL (2024)**  
The study explored Warli art's journey from tribal wall paintings to its modern use in textiles, fashion, and home décor. It examined government initiatives aimed at promoting Warli art as a sustainable livelihood for tribal communities. The research supports the idea of integrating Warli motifs into bedroom interiors by highlighting both their cultural significance and growing relevance in contemporary design.

## RESULTS AND ANALYSIS

The research incorporated a three-part methodology: visual analysis, user-based survey, and design experimentation. Visual Analysis revealed that Warli carvings, when placed thoughtfully on wall panels, doors, curtain panels, and furniture elements, enhance cultural value without disturbing the minimalistic aesthetics of the room. Strategic placement and subtle lighting elevated the look, especially in areas like wardrobe panels and feature walls. Survey Results (from 34 participants) showed:

- 73.5% were already aware of Warli art.
- 64.7% liked the idea of including traditional art in bedrooms, with 58.8% preferring a minimal and subtle application.
- 52.9% preferred Warli motifs on wall panels, 50% on wardrobes, and 38.2% on headboards.
- Beige, terracotta, and white were the most favoured color choices.
- 55.9% were open to Warli carvings on selected furniture pieces.
- Over 80% agreed that using Warli in modern interiors helps preserve Indian heritage.
- Motivations included aesthetic appeal, uniqueness, cultural connection, and support for artisans.

Design Experimentation supported these findings by presenting a realistic bedroom layout in AutoCAD, using four elevations to integrate Warli art in panels,

furniture, and soft furnishings with appropriate lighting to highlight the carvings.

#### DISCUSSION

The study demonstrates a growing inclination among users to embrace traditional art in modern interiors, especially when designed with restraint and elegance. Warli art's geometric, symbolic simplicity makes it inherently compatible with minimal design.

Survey data reflects that users are not looking for heavily decorated spaces, but appreciate meaningful touches of culture in elements like carved wardrobe doors, soft motif detailing on furniture, and panel gaps with integrated lighting. Design experimentation further validated that even neutral-toned modern bedrooms can gain identity and emotional depth through such integrations.

The visual consistency in applying Warli art across elevations, combined with user openness to it, highlights the potential of this art form to become part of mainstream modern Indian interior design.

#### CONCLUSION

This research concludes that Warli art, when thoughtfully and minimally integrated, can enhance modern bedroom interiors by adding cultural richness, visual interest, and emotional depth without disrupting the minimalist aesthetic.

Findings suggest that elements like carved wall panels, wardrobe motifs, and furniture detailing offer an ideal canvas for such integration. The positive user responses support the idea that traditional art forms like Warli are not only relevant but also desirable in contemporary home settings.

By balancing functionality with heritage, this study encourages interior designers to explore culturally rooted design solutions that preserve tradition while meeting the visual and functional expectations of modern lifestyles.

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
