


Leaf-Inspired Typography: A Study in Eco-Design and Visual Communication

- Symbolism: The use of leaves directly associates the typeface with eco-friendly messaging.



- Educational Materials: Children's books, environmental awareness campaigns.



5. COMPARISON WITH TRADITIONAL TYPEFACES
