

# Gender Equality and Quality Education for Females in Bhopal District: A Library and Information Science Perspective

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**Abstract-** This research looks at how libraries in Bhopal District, Madhya Pradesh, India, support gender equality and high-quality education for women. Gender disparity in education is still a major problem, especially for women who encounter several institutional and sociocultural obstacles to receiving a good education. As important educational institutions, libraries may help close this gender gap by providing programs and materials that empower women. The study examines the availability of gender-sensitive resources, digital literacy initiatives, career development seminars, and mentoring possibilities in Bhopal's public, school, and community libraries. The research investigates how these libraries assist the academic and personal development of female students using surveys, interviews with female students and instructors, and the examination of library items. Key results demonstrate that school libraries require the most work, whereas public libraries provide the most complete gender-sensitive services. Community-based libraries come in second. Notwithstanding encouraging results, obstacles to complete empowerment were found to include things like a lack of mentoring programs, insufficient training for library employees, and problems with physical accessibility. Furthermore, female students often have lower levels of confidence and desire as a consequence of the absence of robust support networks in schools, such as leadership opportunities, career counseling, and mentoring programs for females. As a result of social pressures or a lack of assistance, many girls drop out of school early or struggle to go to higher education<sup>17</sup>.

Libraries provide women and girls the opportunity to freely explore and increase their knowledge in addition to giving them access to educational resources<sup>18-19</sup>. In order to assist girls and women overcome conventional limitations, library services including reading groups, scholarships, job development seminars, and access to digital resources have become crucial<sup>7</sup>. Libraries provide purposes beyond just lending out books<sup>20</sup>. To remove deeply ingrained gender prejudices, they must be a part of a bigger, coordinated effort including local communities, educational institutions, and governmental agencies. It is obvious that support for female education must continue, and that libraries must be given the authority to act as change agents. For example, libraries may work with nearby schools to develop gender-sensitive curriculum, provide gender equality training to teachers, and provide after-school activities that focus on female students, especially those who are at risk of dropping out. Five to seven libraries will be chosen in total, guaranteeing a variety of libraries from Bhopal District's rural and urban regions. The selection of these libraries will be based on their role in supporting female students, accessibility, and the range of services they provide. Public libraries, school libraries, and community-based libraries that promote gender equality and female education will be among the chosen libraries.

#### 2.3.2 Participants

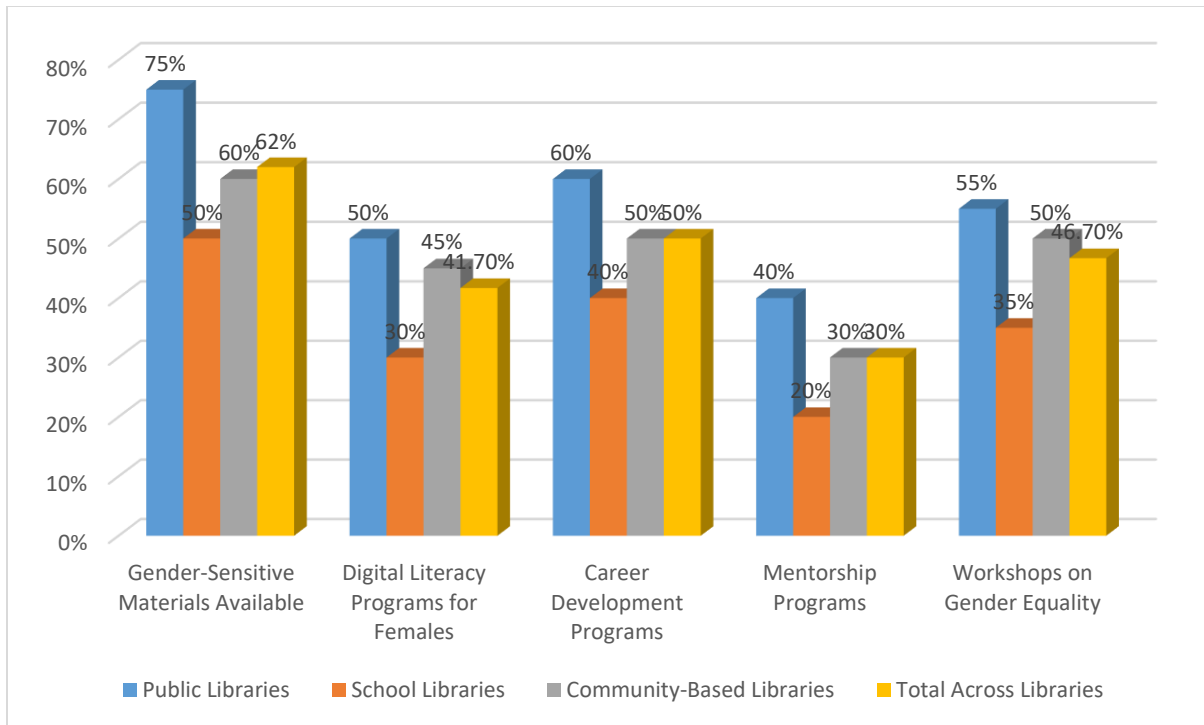
III. RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

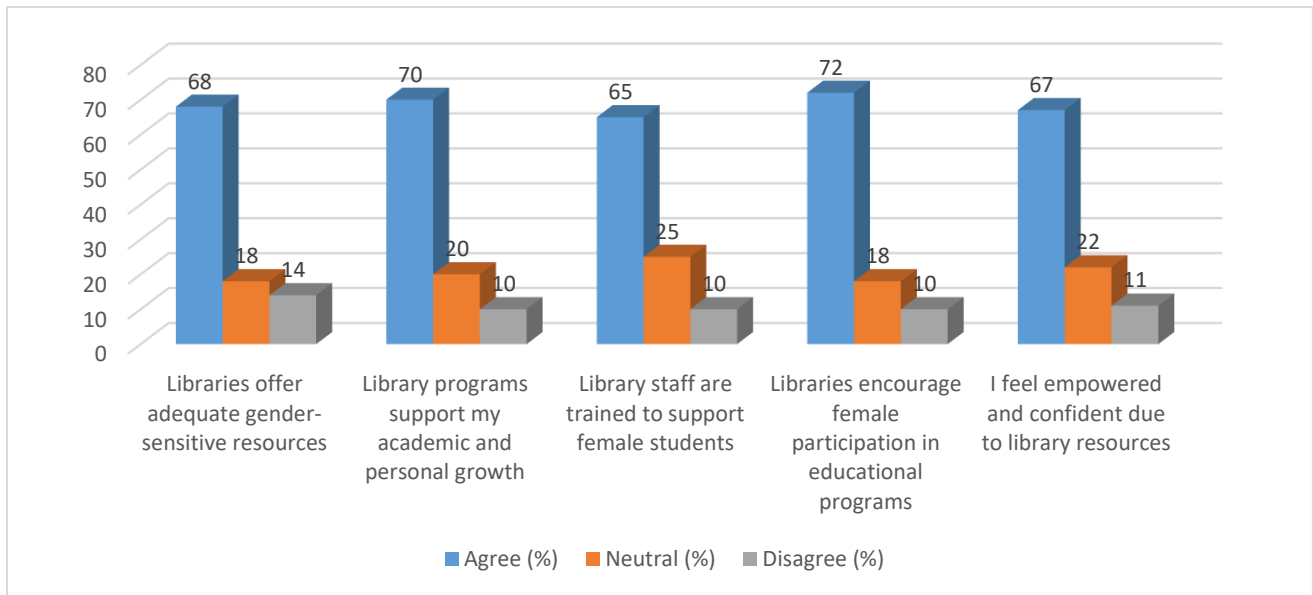
Graph 3.1: Library Resources and Services for Female Students

However, there are fewer materials in school libraries that are explicitly geared toward women, which suggests that there may be a service gap for girls in educational settings. Graph 3.2: Perceptions of Female Students Regarding Library Services

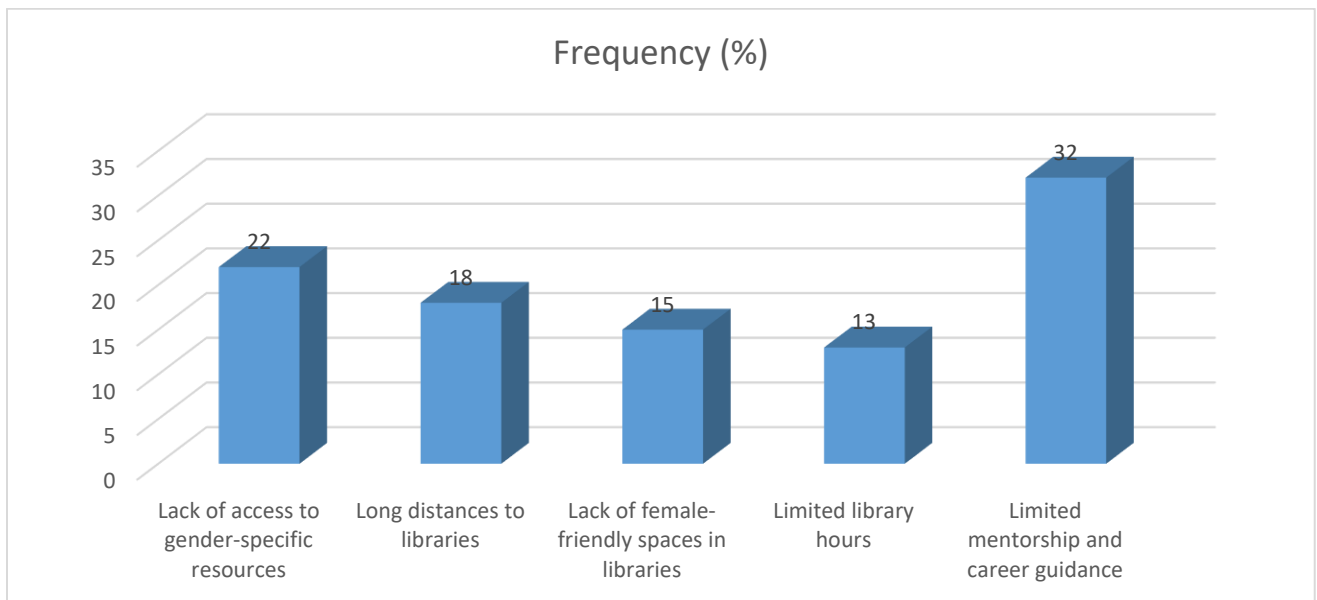
Interpretation:

The biggest obstacles are the lack of career counseling, mentoring, and library resources, especially for female students in remote locations. These results are in line with research that emphasizes the difficulties females have in rural areas when trying to access resources and education, including transportation problems and inadequate support networks in schools. The necessity for gender-sensitive library design that explicitly addresses the requirements of female students is

further highlighted by the comparatively limited number of female-friendly places in libraries.
