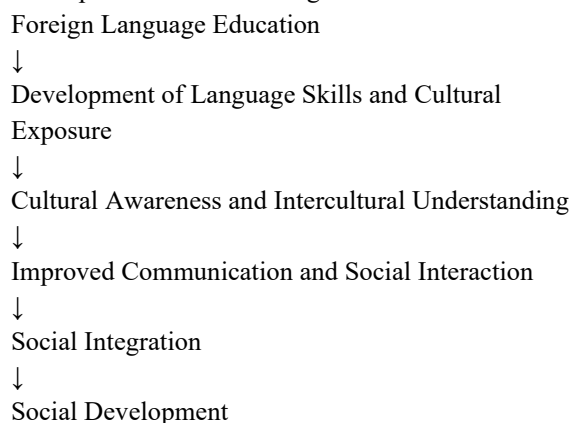
#### Social Development
